*Northern Star* (Lismore, NSW, Australia) Thursday 3 March 1921:

A quiet but pretty wedding took place at the Marrickville Presbyterian church on February 16th at 4 p.m, when David, second son of Mr. and Mrs T. McKinnon, Keen street, Lismore, and **Euphemia, youngest daughter of Donald and the late Mrs. Mc Kechnie**, Isle of Iona, and formerly of Heynish, Isle of Tiree, Scotland, were united in the holy bonds of matrimony. The Rev E. W. Hogben, of Dulwich Hill, performed the ceremony. The bridesmaids were Miss Gwennie Bird and two little tots, Gwen Stride, and Jean McKinnon. The latter carried baskets of cactus dahlias tied with tartan ribbon. Mr. John McKinnon, brother of the bridegroom, was best man. The honeymoon was spent in Sydney and on the South Coast: Their future home will be at "Bunessan," Dunoon road.
